
- Feel sometimes too much for a 7 year old.





- Open Pirates and Captains earlier? 7:30am would make a lot of difference. We can only consider this if there is sufficient demand.
- The new sign in screen in reception is ridiculous. Children should not be classed as late if they are in their classroom before the register closes. Children who arrive in class before the register closes are not marked as being late. Parents/carers are expected to sign their children in when arriving late so that children can go straight to their classrooms. If you have a disability and find it difficult to get your child into school on time, please talk to us we will always do our best to help find a solution.
- Better rewards and recognition for good children.
- Golden Time is a reward given to all children who have made the right choices that week.
- Less pressure on children in regards to paying for trips, other children shouldn't know whose parents have or haven't paid. We agree. Funding trips has become increasingly difficult in recent years – we understand that everyone's budget is being squeezed.
- Continue the outstanding work. Both my children have had a full attendance and look forward to going to school. Thank you.
- More detail to curriculum newsletters so parents know what children are learning in advance. We are updating our curriculum information in light of the new curriculum requirements. There will be a lot of information available on our website. Watch this space...

- Class teachers using Dojos more as my son hardly gets any when he's been told
 in class he has. Most of you are very enthusiastic about Dojo; however, we
 recognise that we can improve the way it is used to be consistent and effective
 across the whole school.
- Quicker assessment for those children with problems as the quicker issues are identified, then the quicker they can start to be rectified. We agree and always do as much as we can but unfortunately children are added to waiting lists that we have no control over.

Regrettably, plans do occasionally change but we try to avoid this as much as possible.

 doing the best we can with a limited budget. Places may be available in Pirates
 Club.
- Would love if Forest Schools was introduced. Great news our Forest School should be installed ready for September!

Q13: Suggestions for improvement.

- Less meat on the school menu and more veggie options. I've seen mention of reducing plastic but the biggest impact we can have on the planet is to stop eating meat. Also mixed messages around healthy eating as such as they can't bring fizzy drinks etc. into school but seem to be able to get a cake with lunch every day and buy sweets in school every Friday. We will have a chat with the catering team; all food provided as part of a school meal meets with appropriate school standards. Treat Friday is an FoLPS fundraising initiative available for those who want to provide an occasional treat for their child/ren whilst also supporting the school.
- More trips would be nice.
- I don't understand the school's funding system and I know in this economy we are living in difficult times for both families, schools and most of the country. However, I feel that when funding school trips there must be a better way to inform parents and help to fund these experiences for our children.
- Scrap 'voluntary contributions'; it's not voluntary to pay for a school trip if it will be cancelled if people don't pay. Also explain the cost as £13 for a trip to Underwater Street when it says on their website it's £7.95 per school child does not make sense! The DfE insist we can only ask for voluntary contributions and we respect that some families find it harder than others to fund such opportunities. Unfortunately, it is not just the cost of entry to such places, the cost of transport is very often the largest expense for a trip. We aim to charge no more than the cost of the trip and nowadays there is usually a shortfall—sadly the school budget no longer has the capacity to cover the remaining balance. We are constantly looking at a better way to fund trips—some year groups arrange their own fundraising to ensure trips can go ahead. We are also increasingly using our minibus for short, local trips to help reduce trip costs.

- Continue the outstanding work. Both my children have had a full attendance and look forward to going to school. Thank you.
- More detail to curriculum newsletters so parents know what children are learning in advance. We are updating our curriculum information in light of the new curriculum requirements. There will be a lot of information available on our website. Watch this space...
- Stop people carrying dogs from entering the grounds. If there is a no dogs rule, this needs enforcing. We do try our best and appreciate support from all.

- Class teachers using Dojos more as my son hardly gets any when he's been told
 in class he has. Most of you are very enthusiastic about Dojo; however, we
 recognise that we can improve the way it is used to be consistent and effective
 across the whole school.
- Quicker assessment for those children with problems as the quicker issues are identified, then the quicker they can start to be rectified. We agree and always do as much as we can but unfortunately children are added to waiting lists that we have no control over.
- Open both sides of the gate at the start and end of school only opening one side is creating a problem for children and parents entering and exiting the premises. We will look into this.
- Perhaps organising more female football matches. I'm biased here, but that would be great. We will see what we can do – we'd love to help develop future lionesses! Our girls have won a recent inter-school competition!
- More timely communication for events, things happening at the school. Sometimes feels a bit last minute. Also with date changes. We have an annual planner available on our website and printed copies available at low cost – these show as many pre-planned events as possible. Regrettably, plans do occasionally change but we try to avoid this as much as possible.
- More extra-curricular activities especially for the younger children. We are
 doing the best we can with a limited budget. Places may be available in Pirates
 Club.
- Would love if Forest Schools was introduced. Great news our Forest School should be installed ready for September!

Q13: Suggestions for improvement.

- Less meat on the school menu and more veggie options. I've seen mention of reducing plastic but the biggest impact we can have on the planet is to stop eating meat. Also mixed messages around healthy eating as such as they can't bring fizzy drinks etc. into school but seem to be able to get a cake with lunch every day and buy sweets in school every Friday. We will have a chat with the catering team; all food provided as part of a school meal meets with appropriate school standards. Treat Friday is an FoLPS fundraising initiative available for those who want to provide an occasional treat for their child/ren whilst also supporting the school.
- More trips would be nice.
- I don't understand the school's funding system and I know in this economy we are living in difficult times for both families, schools and most of the country.
 However, I feel that when funding school trips there must be a better way to inform parents and help to fund these experiences for our children.
- Scrap 'voluntary contributions'; it's not voluntary to pay for a school trip if it will be cancelled if people don't pay. Also explain the cost as £13 for a trip to Underwater Street when it says on their website it's £7.95 per school child does not make sense! The DfE insist we can only ask for voluntary contributions and we respect that some families find it harder than others to fund such opportunities. Unfortunately, it is not just the cost of entry to such places, the cost of transport is very often the largest expense for a trip. We aim to charge no more than the cost of the trip and nowadays there is usually a shortfall—sadly the school budget no longer has the capacity to cover the remaining balance. We are constantly looking at a better way to fund trips—some year groups arrange their own fundraising to ensure trips can go ahead. We are also increasingly using our minibus for short, local trips to help reduce trip costs.
