Feedback from the Swimming Survey

Thank you to the 50 parents who completed the survey. The results are as follows:-

Has your child enjoyed the swimming pool?

97.5% Yes 2.5% No

Was your child comfortable with the changing facilities? 20% 80% Yes No

Do you feel your child's confidence in swimming has improved?

80% 20% Yes No

Do you think school should use a temporary pool again? 88% Yes 12% No

Suggestions to improve

This should continue; keep the pool; lessons over a term; more swimming; after school swimming; better changing area; option to dry hair; pool for longer time; more time in the pool; getting the timetable earlier; an adult in the pool for non swimmers.

Swimming is a statutory element of the PE curriculum. We booked a swimmimg pool on site as a trial to see whether we could offer swimming lessons to all Key Stage 2 year groups, rather than just Year 6. 350 children had swimming lessons.

The children in EYRC took advantage of the lovely weather to plan and take part in a picnic.




Mrs Pinnington's class had the highest attendance across Foundation 2 for the fifth week running.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

Money muling involves individuals—very frequently young people—being recruited to transfer (legally obtained funds into and out of their bank account on behall of criminals (often without even realising that's the kind of activity they we become embrailed in), and usually being allowed to keep a certain amount for themselves. (I's essentially a digital form of money laundering.
