CURRICULUM GUIDE

Reading Opportunities

During both half terms, we will read and enjoy a range of exciting and engaging texts through:

- · Regular Guided Reading Sessions
- · Cracking Comprehension
- · Poetry
- · Bug Club
- · Class story

Reading book bags will be sent home daily and should be brought into school daily. Children will bring their Guided Reading book home, we would appreciate your support in hearing your child read every day.

Mathematics Opportunities

In the Autumn term children will explore place value of numbers the addition and subtraction of numbers. We will explore number bonds within 10, identifying numbers pictorially and with concrete resources.

We will also learn about:

- · Properties of 2 and 3D shapes
- · Number lines
- · Comparative language

Throughout the term we will continue to develop our mental recall, reasoning to explain what we know and problem solving in real life

contexts (e.g. money and measure). Each child will continue to develop their skills using ICT in Maths through Sumdog, Bond Builder, Busy Things and Numbots.





Over the course of the Autumn term we will use a variety of fiction core texts to inform our writing. We will explore different genres and develop our own writing style. We will work on recounts, instructions and different types of narrative writing.

We will also spend time practising our letter formation with regular handwriting sessions. Children will continue to have daily phonics where they will consolidate their previous learning and explore alternative spellings of sounds they are already familiar with.

Social, Moral, Spiritual, Cultural

We will continue to develop an understanding of social, moral, spiritual and cultural experiences across our different subjects. Our weekly Class Council sessions will be a forum for us to share our views and respond to the views of others. Keep track of our fantastic work and experiences on the Class Dojo!





Cross Curricular

As geographers we will find out about out local area and enjoy a walk around Liscard.

As designers and creators we will design and make our own playgrounds.

As scientists we will investigate the seasons of Autumn and Winter and also animals including humans.

As historians we will learn about toys from the past.

As musicians we will be listening carefully to music and talking about rhythm. We will also be singing and performing our own music. At the end of the year we will perform our Christmas production.

As athletes we will look forward to developing multi skills and different team games.
